Registration Steps



- Attend a **UAI Adult Archery Program** Orientation session
- Complete the **UAI Adult Archery Program** Membership Application
- Sign and turn in the **UAI Adult Archery Program** Waiver/Photo Release
- Sign the **USA Archery** Photo Release, Code of Conduct, & Waiver

Prior to Competing in any USA Archery sanctioned tournament/event

- Join USA Archery (include copy of member card)

Age: 18+ years old.

Waivers: The USA Archery waiver and UAI Adult Archery Program waiver are required, and each individual or family member must complete the waivers prior to using the range.

Orientation: Orientation must be taken before adult archers can shoot in the regular sessions or before becoming UAI Adult Archery Program members. Class size will depend on coach availability. Email the Club Administrator (clubhouse@uaii.org) to schedule an Orientation.

UAI AAP Membership AND USA Archery Membership: Please note that USA Archery membership and UAI AAP Membership are separate memberships. A UAI AAP membership is required even if an archer has their own equipment and wants to use the range during session times.

USA Archery Membership: USA Archery Membership is required for participation in any club tournament competition or USA Archery sanctioned event. Go to www.teamusa.org/USA-Archery/Membership to apply. USA Archery and UAI AAP do not sell or share your private information. **Please affiliate your membership with the AMERICAN INDIAN CLUBHOUSE** “

UAI AAP Recommends a full USA Archery Membership: We recommend that all archers who think that they might want to participate in a competition in their first year obtain a full USA Archery membership (Family, Adult, Lifetime). *Recreational members are not eligible to participate in JOAD/AAP or competitions.*

Frequently asked questions

Do I need to become a member of USA Archery? **No.** If you would like to compete at a USA Archery sanctioned event, you WILL need to have a current membership, but it is not needed if you would like to shoot with the UAll AAP Program only. If you would like to participate in the Pin Achievement Program, you will need to be a current member of USA Archery.

Do I need to attend the UAll AAP orientation session before I can use the field or attend lessons? **Yes.** All must attend. Archers learn the basics needed to begin lessons. More importantly, the archers learn about range and archery safety.

Do you accept “walk-ins” for orientation sessions? **No.** Because of limited space, we do not accept walk-ins for orientation.

Do I need to sign the UAll AAP and the USA Archery waivers each membership year? **Yes.** The USA Archery waiver and the UAll AAP waiver and Photo Release form need to be updated each year.

What is AAP? Adult Archery Program (AAP) is a goal-orientated award programs. Adults earn star pins for reaching set score goals at set distances. You will notice many archers with these award lanyards on their quivers at the field or at competitions. You need to be a current USA Archery member and a member of the UAll AAP (The American Indian Clubhouse) program to be eligible to earn star pins.

Do I have to be American Indian to participate? **No.** Although, if you are registered with a service at UAll, your USA Archery Membership may be covered by the program. If you are not eligible for UAll services, you are then responsible for the annual USA Archery annual membership fee.

Do you offer fee USA Archery Membership fee waivers? **Yes.** If you are willing to contribute at least 20 hours / year to helping with our JOAD program, the American Indian Clubhouse will pay your annual fees.

Can I bring my own equipment to the range? **Yes.** Although you must follow all range rules. No crossbows, broad head tips, or compound bow at UAll indoor range.

What is the official Club name? The official club name is the American Indian Clubhouse. This is the name for both the JOAD and AAP programs registered with USA Archery. It is the name of the club you will affiliate you USA Archery Membership with.
